"We held bedside meetings, received instructions and he demanded until the last that we continue the fight for our members even when he couldn't."

AHA NSW Senior Vice-President Lyn Humphreys said her long-time best mate always had three loves in his life – "his Pub, his boats and his AHA."

"The passion with which he lived his life was the same passion he gave to our industry and I am grateful to have had my big buddy as a mentor and a guide," she said.

"His loss will be felt by so many who have been touched by his generosity, his time for others, his understanding of the industry and his zest for life. A big man who leaves a huge legacy."

AHA NSW CEO John Whelan said his friend's "commitment to the AHA NSW and improving the trading environment for all of the state's hoteliers was legendary."
